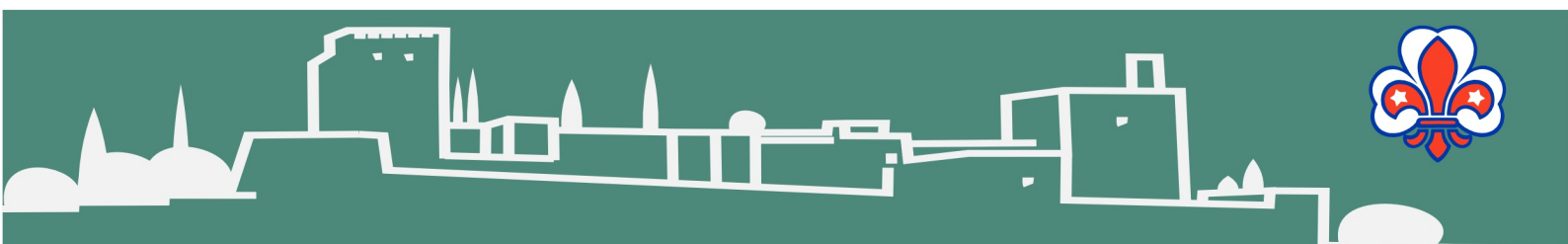


Dear participants:

Highlights:

- **Pick up of participants and transfer to the hotel:** in order to adequately prepare your welcome, before September 10, you must complete [Arrival data form](#) on the Conference website with your travel details. We will organize the pick-up of participants arriving in Malaga and Granada by bus on the morning of September 17 at the time we will indicate later.



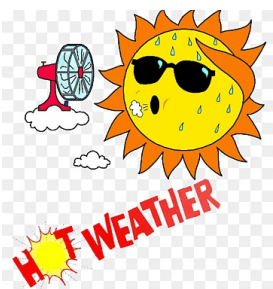
- **Check-in and accommodation:** upon arrival at the hotel Abades Nevada (Calle de la Sultana, 3, 18008, Granada, tel. +34 958327200) in the lobby, you must present an identification document and you will receive your credential and welcome kit. Delegates from the different countries will hand their flag (1m high x 1.5m wide) to the person assigned to receive it. Participants attending as accompanying persons must present their registration upon arrival. You will then proceed to the hotel reception desk (check-in), where you will be assigned a room and given a key.



- **Required documentation:** for the reception at the hotel and the visit to the Alhambra it is essential to show the official identification document or passport.



- **Clothing:** when packing your luggage, keep in mind that the weather in Granada in September is hot (28°/15°). It is mandatory to be in uniform for the opening ceremony at the Paraninfo on September 18 in the morning. The group photo will be taken there. For the excursions on September 20, wear comfortable clothes and shoes. At the gala dinner on Saturday, September 21, you may dress either elegantly or in typical national dress.



- **Luggage:** we recommend summer clothes with some warmer clothes for the night. As it is a light luggage, we suggest leaving some free space in the suitcase to buy local souvenirs, such as handicrafts and other typical objects, as well as products from the ISGF-AISG association stores or the World Market.





- **Plenary sessions and workshops:** Within the program, during the plenary sessions, presentations prepared by the ANSGs that have requested it will be projected. For proper organization, ANSGs are kindly requested to send their presentation before the start of the Conference to the following address: worldbureau@isgf.org to the attention of Nathalie Henrard.

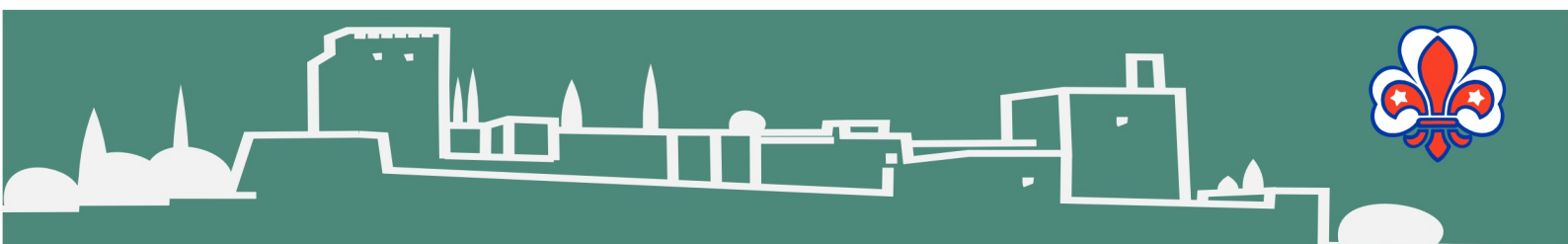
- The Italian and Norwegian NSGF has made a Proposal to the World conference concerning the the UN document "Agenda 2030 for sustainable development" and World Bank document "World Development Report 2023 - Migrants, refugees and societies" as a continuation of the work started at the Bali Conference. The aim is to make a resolution from the World Conference that all NSGFs can agree upon. In connection with this work at the conference we kindly ask all participant NSGFs to bring with them a short presentation of work they do to better the environment or to help migrants or immigrants. We would like to see work that is done by local guilds either together with young people or on their own. You can make the presentation oral, with pictures or posters or by digital media. The presentation should take a maximum of 3 minutes. It should be done in English, French or Spanish. Your presentation will be used in connection with a workshop in one of these languages on Thursday 19th September.

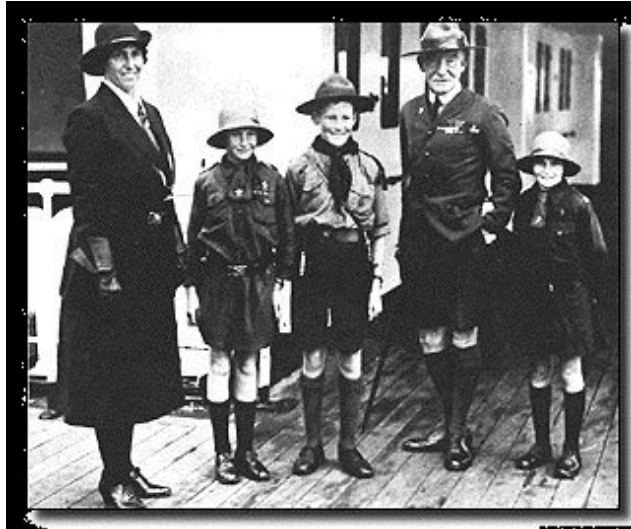


- **Sightseeing tours of the city, excursions around the province and post-conference trips:** Conference attendees, as accompanying persons, will enjoy a specific program of activities with sightseeing tours of the city. All participants will have the opportunity to get to know the province during the excursions on Friday, September 20. This organization, which depends on the Provincial Council, has provided valuable support to this Conference so that it can offer an enriching experience for everyone.



- On the 22nd, the two post-conference trips will begin, one to Andalusia and the other to Castilla. Although the trip to Castilla does not meet the minimum number of participants required in principle, the agency Halcón Viajes has finally decided to organize it.



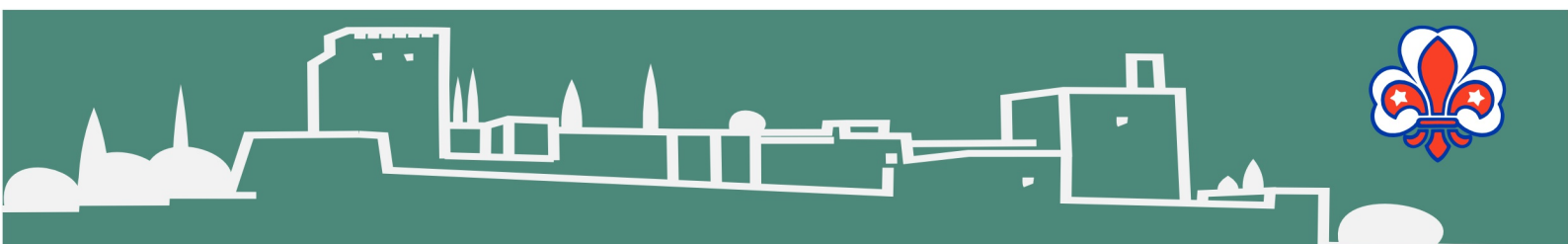
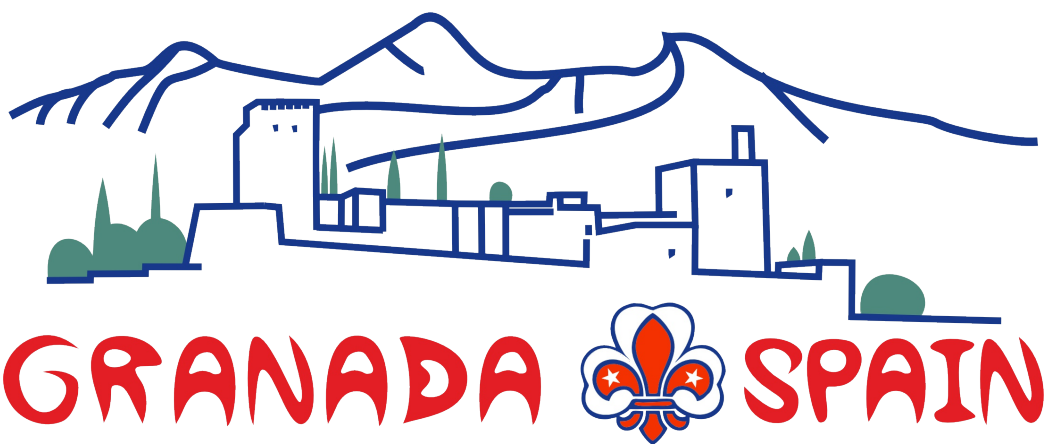
